Brunei – Japan Local Administration Seminar

n 13th November 2007, CLAIR Singapore co-organised a local administration seminar with Brunei's Ministry of Home Affairs and The Embassy of Japan in Brunei. The seminar was held at The Empire Hotel and Country Club in Jerudong, Brunei.

This seminar aims at establishing a platform that facilitates the exchange and sharing of not only experience, but also know-how pertaining to the administration between Brunei and Japan. It is hoped that through the mutual exchange of ideas among the relevant parties, the quality and efficiency of administration in both countries could be leveraged to greater heights. The theme for the seminar has been focused on 'local welfare systems'. In this respect, around 60 participants from the various governmental organisations in Brunei, for example The Ministry of Home Affairs, Ministry of Health, Ministry of Culture, Youth and Sports have attended the seminar.

Opening addresses were made by The Deputy Minister of Home Affairs, Pehin Dato Paduka Haji Dani bin Haji Ibrahim and also The Ambassador of Japan in Brunei Darussalam, His Excellency Hashimoto Itsuo. This was followed by a brief introduction to Japan by Mr. Chiba Yoshihiro, Director of CLAIR Singa-

In Mr. Sato's presentation, case studies of the various local welfare systems existing in Aomori City, such as the Welfare Commissioners, Neighbourhood Associations and Volunteer Fire Rescue Teams were explored in detail. These voluntary welfare systems complement the roles of Aomori City Government, which result in local residents being able to receive better welfare services. Participants from Brunei showed great interest in the subject matter.

Social welfare services in Brunei are basically provided by the central government. Services provided by volunteer organisations are rare in the country. As a result, during the Questions and Answers Session, many participants asked questions and expressed their opinions pertaining to the responsibilities and capacity building of Welfare Commissioners, the cost effectiveness of implementing volunteer welfare systems by NGOs and also other matters. Delegates from Bangkok Metropolitan Administration visited Japan

From 3rd to 10th June 2007, six delegates from the International Affairs Department of Bangkok Metropolitan Administration in Thailand visited Japan as a part of their staff training programme. The objective of their visit is to study the international affairs and exchange policies implemented by Japanese local authorities. In this respect, CLAIR Singapore and its headquarters in Tokyo coordinated with Bangkok Metropolitan Administration in locating the suitable Japanese local authorities for its staff training programme.

Firstly, the delegates visited the headquarters of CLAIR in Tokyo and had a brief lecture on CLAIR and its activities, sister-city affiliation programmes, and the JET (Japan Exchange and Teaching) Programme. Then they visited Yokohama City Government to discuss about matters relating to international exchange such as Yokohama's new sister-city affiliation programme, incentives of new city-to-city cooperation, and the services provided by Yokohama City for foreign residents. On 6th June 2007, the delegates visited Saitama Prefectural Government Office, Kasukabe Girls High School, and Centre for Environmental Science in Saitama. Through the visits, the delegates enhanced their knowledge on local internationalisation activities implemented in Japan.

The delegates participated in an explanatory meeting hosted by the Tokyo Metropolitan Government on the next day, whereby the emphasis was placed on the current circumstances and future trends of international cooperation by Tokyo Metropolitan Government.



During the visits, delegates from Bangkok Metropolitan Government actively exchanged opinions with the Japanese local authorities. The delegates said that they were able to deepen their understandings about the international affairs and exchange policies implemented by the various local authorities in Japan.

Research Team from University of Malaya visited Laos and Cambodia with CLAIR staff

The research team from University of Malaya had a mission to conduct comparative studies on the local financial systems of Malaysia and other ASEAN countries such as Laos, Vietnam, Cambodia and Indonesia. With the assistance of CLAIR Singapore, the group visited various government bodies and universities in the four countries in December last year, gaining valuable insights on the local financial systems of each country.

On 5th December 2007, CLAIR staff accompanied the research team of University of Malaya on their visit to Laos.
