
## Free Shuttle Buses

For timetables, please refer to the website.




\*These buses do not go to Konan Station.

### Access by Car

- **Tokai-Hokuriku Expressway**  
About 20-30 minutes from Ichinomiya-Kisogawa IC.
- **Tomei Expressway**  
About 30 minutes on Route 155 from Komaki IC.

### Access by Public Transportation

20 minutes from Meitetsu Nagoya Station to Konan Station on the Meitetsu Inuyama Line.

15 minutes by bus bound for Konan Danchi and get off at Mandaraji bus stop.

15 minutes from Meitetsu Nagoya Station to Meitetsu Ichinomiya Station on the Meitetsu Nagoya Main Line. 30 minutes by bus bound for Konan Danchi and get off at Mandaraji bus stop.

### Convenient access from Inuyama City

10 minutes from Meitetsu Inuyama Station to Meitetsu Konan Station on the Meitetsu Inuyama Line.

## Konan City History Guide Association (Free)

Available daily during Wisteria Festival from 10:30 AM – 3:30 PM

As volunteer guides, they guide tourists who wish to visit the Konan city's cultural assets designated by the government, the prefecture, and the city, so that visitors can deepen their understanding and interest. During the Wisteria Festival, they also provide guides for Mandara Temple and wisteria flowers.

## Mandara Temple Treasure Exhibition (fee required)

Many national cultural assets are open to the public, including the Main Hall, the Nigabyakudo Garden, a recently-discovered Tainai Butsu (a small Buddha statue within a larger Buddha statue), and a Seisatsu edict board issued by Oda Nobunaga. We hope you take this opportunity to visit and take a look.

The wooden Bodhisattva Kannon and Tainai Butsu of Bodhisattva mahāsattva will be open to the public for viewing.

## Main Events

### Saturday, April 18: Opening Event

### Wednesday, April 29 (holiday): Yomemi Festival

### Saturday, May 2: Konan Wisteria Bread Festival

Konan City bakeries will gather for a special bread market.



## Gourmet Options at the Venue

### Fujinohana Liqueur

This liqueur was created as part of a town revitalization project using industrial resources from a local brewery with almost 200 years of tradition and history.



### Anpusankira

This Japanese sweet represents Owari Region. It is characterized by the soft and chewy texture of wheat gluten, the delicate sweetness of smooth red bean paste, and the aroma and saltiness of sarsaparilla leaves (in Japanese, sankira).



### Mandara Mochi

These mochi cakes are covered with roasted soybean flour and have a smooth texture. It was first sold about 50 years ago and is still made using the same traditional method.



### Dengaku

This grilled tofu is coated with aroma-packed miso. Dengaku is one of the regional dishes of Aichi Prefecture.
